Flywheel Markets in Brasov, Romania

Dealing for cross-sector solutions in Ghent, Belgium

Ghent engages in "fair local deal"-making on a local level as a local and multi-stakeholder response to the European Green Deal.

The key goal is climate-neutrality through cross-field collaboration between the energy, food, mobility, greening, housing (...) sectors.

Studying this case amongst others (Mannheim, Aarhus+++) we've learned that:



- Effective facilitation is key, and budget allocation ensures professional process moderation.
- Rotating meeting locations can introduce stakeholders to the reality of other sectors and inspire motivation through tangible experiences.
