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1. Overview

The FOODPathS Festival programme is designed to inspire and stimulate the discussion with participants on <u>how</u> to make food systems sustainable through the collaboration among different stakeholders, working together (*in partnership*) on Research & Innovation, science for Policy and Education (RIPE).

On the first day, participants will discover more about how FOODPathS envisage the multi-actor collaboration on food systems sustainability, launching its "prototype" for a partnership. After that, they will be inspired by talks focusing on the context, spanning from policy to society.

The second day is dedicated to the discussion of the elements of the prototype: having in mind inputs received on the first day, participants will provide their feedback on the proposed solution, sharing suggestions for their improvement and possible scenarios for their adoption.

On the last and final day, the discussion will focus on the uptake of the partnership prototype and on the FOODPathS future work. Stakeholders of the food systems will dialogue around the if and how the solutions proposed can improve their collaborative work to transform food systems, complemented by a final session to discuss the future steps and the role that FOODPathS can have in this process.

During the whole event, participants will interact, network and have the possibility to learn and share about ongoing initiatives and future opportunities on the food systems challenges.

Celebrating the Sustainable Food Systems Partnership prototype

A Sustainable Food Systems Partnership: the FOODPathS' way Plenary session, live streaming – 14.00-15.30

How can we ensure that food systems transformation reflects all voices from farm to fork? How can a partnership be orchestrated to overcome challenges and drive sustainability? And what key elements must come together to create meaningful change? The Festival will open trying to address these questions through the launch of the SFS Partnership prototype: FOODPathS will present a proposal for a body that can support the food systems transformation in Europe, based on the opinions and ideas collected from stakeholders through different initiatives (interviews, surveys, workshops, etc.) in the last three years. The partnership prototype will be presented starting from its constituting "pieces", the RIPE (Research & Innovation & science to Policy & Education) elements; then, it will be showed how they can be composed into a puzzle and work together to contribute to food systems transition. During the session, that will set the stage for the discussion of the following days, the audience will interact with speakers.

The scope of the second day of the conference is to dive into each puzzle piece composing the FOODPathS proposed prototype and discuss them. After a short introduction, participants will join parallel sessions where they can discuss aspects related to education, observatory system for a partnership, funding mechanism, inclusion of stakeholders, etc. In each session, they can share their views, experience, best practices and learn from each other; moreover, participants can provide feedback on if and how they intend to adopt and use FOODPathS' results and suggestions for working in partnership at local, national and global levels.

Session 1.1 – A "Manual" for a Partnership

During this session, the final version of the Manual of the Prototype Partnership will be presented, providing an overview on its main elements (governance, modus operandi, food system approaches, RIPE concept) and on the key Activity Areas identified (such as Funding Strategies, Observatories, Knowledge Hub of FS Labs, Network of University-driven Ecosystems, Mirror Groups and Engagement Strategies). Participants will provide feedback on the missing "pieces of puzzle", on clarification and further elaboration needed.

Session 1.2 - The funding perspective towards food systems R&I

Deep dive into the programming and funding cycle. How to plan, design, evaluate, fund and perform R&I to transform food systems?

Session 1.3 - Enhancing collaboration through the Knowledge Hub

The Knowledge Hub of Food System Labs connects R&I, Science-to-Policy, and Education to drive sustainable food system solutions. Through interactive discussions, participants will identify best practices for strengthening collaboration, aligning priorities, and maximizing the impact of the Knowledge Hub in bridging these sectors effectively.

Session 2.1- Portfolio management, science advice and education: what is the link?


Beyond the horizon: the FOODPathS legacy for Horizon Europe partnerships *Plenary session, live streaming – 11.30-12.30*
